

# Free paper shredding in Fairfield proves a success

FAIRFIELD — Participants in ongoing effort to boost recycling and support a regional nonprofit announced the results of their efforts Monday.

Gone for Good, through a partnership between the city of Fairfield, the United Cerebral Palsy of North Bay and the Fairfield Main Street Association, shredded and recycled 20,008 pounds of confidential papers and recycled 12,679 pounds of electronic waste for residents and businesses, according to a press release. Another 325 pounds of used clothing went to United Cerebral Palsy of North Bay's thrift stores.

Collections came during a series of free confidential paper shredding, e-waste and used clothing drop-off events this year. Free, confidential paper shredding and e-waste drop off events will resume in March 2015 in downtown Fairfield, according to the release. Check Fairfield's website to verify the dates and times.
